Historic Name: Clark-Luck House

Date or Period: ca.1910

Original Use: Residence

Vicinity: Manassas

"A two story, hip-roofed, frame-constructed residence built on a side-hall plan, this home's most striking feature is the one-story, columned porch spanning its front and northeast side. The front gable contains a decorative and useful fan window. Interior features include a two-flight, open-string stair; molded, square oak newels; and oak floors. The structure is known as the Cannon – Luck house because, while the Cannons owned it first, the Lucks were long-time owners. The house was built by Elmer Metz for Francis A. Cannon, a Manassas contractor. The house's simplicity adds to the quaint and tranquil feeling of the area of Manassas where it is located.
