

Prince William County to Wit:

Be it remembered that on this 30th day of March 1868 Joseph t. Janney and Edward Hammill of the said County personally came before me William Fraser a Justice of the said County and severally acknowledged themselves to owe to the Commonwealth of Virginia that is to say the said J. T. Janney the sum of \$100 dollars and the said E. Hammill the sum of \$100 dollars to be respectfully made and levied of their several goods and chattels lands and tenements and if the said Joseph T. Janney shall make default in the performance of the condition underwritten. The condition of the above recognizance is such that if the above bound J. T. Janney shall keep the peace and be of good behavior towards all of the citizens of this Commonwealth and especially towards William Fraser for and during the term of one year from the day thereof then this recognizance shall be void otherwise to remain in full force and virtue.
