Clerk's Loose Papers
25 February 1898

Be it remembered that on this the 25th day of February 1898, J. W. Dawson and C. M. Swartz, of the said county, personally came before me, T. E. Garnett, a justice of the said county, and severally acknowledged themselves, to owe to the Commonwealth of Virginia the said J. W. Dawson the sum of twenty five dollars, and the said C. M. Swartz the sum of twenty five dollars, to be respectively made and levied of their several goods and chattels, lands and tenements, if he the said J. W. Dawson shall make default in the performance of the condition underwritten.

The condition of the above recognizance is such that if the above bound J. W. Dawson shall keep the peace and be of good behavior towards all the citizens of this Commonwealth, and especially towards Susan Minor for and during the term of one year from the day hereof, then this recognizance shall be void, otherwise to remain in full force and virtue..
