

Commonwealth vs Wesley L. Teasdale
Virginia, Ninth Judicial District
Prince William County to wit
In the Circuit Court of the said County
Indictment of Grand Jury – Larceny &c. – “A True Bill”

The Jurors of the Commonwealth of Virginia in and for the body of the County of Prince William and now attending the said court, upon their oath present that Wesley L. Teasdale on the 22nd day of July 1869 in the said county one horse of the value of one hundred and fifty dollars of the goods and chattels of one Ezekiel Lynn then and there being found feloniously did steal take and carry away against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth of Virginia.

Second Count: And the Jurors aforesaid farther present that the said Wesley L. Teasdale, to wit, on the day and year aforesaid, in the county aforesaid, one horse of the value of one hundred and fifty dollars of the goods and chattels of one Ezekiel Lynn, then lately before feloniously stolen, taken, and carried away, feloniously did receive and hold in his possession, he the said Wesley L. Teasdale, then and there well knowing the said horse to have been feloniously stolen, taken and carried away against the Peace and Dignity of the Commonwealth of Virginia.
