"Some distance south of Occoquan on the Old Telegraph Road, County 638, is the site of COTTAGE TAVERN, a well known hostelry before the main highway was shifted to its present course, Owned by the Lynn's and Davies, it was sold for the first time in 1890 when Rufus Davis transferred a part of the Cottage Tavern tract to George Tansill. In the burying ground nearby are legible inscriptions to Julia F. Flynn, May H. Moore (1840-1882), James L. Moore (1864-1865), John E. Moore (1876-1880), Sterling Moore (1879-infant).
