James W. Driscoll vs William Claytor

To the Sheriff of Caroline County – Greetings:

You are hereby commanded, that of the goods and chattels of William Claytor late in your bailiwick, you cause to be made the sum of \$137.44 which James W. Driscoll late in our county Court of Prince William, hath recovered against him for damages also \$25.27 which by the same Court were adjudged to the said James W. Driscoll for his costs by him about his suit in that behalf expended, whereof the said Claytor is convict, as appears to us of record; and that you have the same before the Justices of our said county Court, at the Court House of the said county, on the first Monday in October next, to render unto the said Driscoll of the damages and costs aforesaid; and have then there this writ. Witness JOHN WILLIAMS, Clerk of our said Court, at the Court House aforesaid, this 27<sup>th</sup> day of August 1842, and in the 67 year of the Commonwealth.

**(This case started 5 June 1833 and it is not clear if Claytor ever paid the debt to Driscoll. William Claytor is credited with building the Brentsville Court House and James Driscoll was the builder of the Jail.)**
