J. C. Weedon vs J. C. Goods & P. D. Lipscomb  
Slave Contract

We bind ourselves our heirs, executors, administrators jointly and severally to pay or cause to be paid to J. C. Weedon administrator of Thomas Nelson dec'd his heirs or assigns the full and just sum of Fifty Dollars on or before the 1<sup>st</sup> day of January 1853 for the hire of the slave Lundy for the present year 1852 and to furnish said Slave with two pair of summer pantaloons two shirts a twilled yarn fustian coat pantaloon and vest, shoes and socks, hat and blanket and not to employ him in fishing shore or long boats nor on any public works nor underhire him to be so employed and return him on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of January 1853.
