

Clerks Loose Papers

In Prince William County Court November 5<sup>th</sup> 1867

The court proceeded to the examination of John McCall a white man, the said John McCall was set to the bar in custody of the jailor of this county and charged that he did, on the 6<sup>th</sup> day of June in the year 1865 in the county of Prince William two sorrel geldings and one sorrel mare of the value of two hundred and fifty dollars of the goods and chattels of one James W. Wilkins feloniously steal take and carry away whereupon sundry witnesses were examined and the prisoner by counsel heard on his defence. On consideration whereof the court is of the opinion that a felony has been committed and that there is probable cause to charge the said John W. McCall there with, and doth remand him to the circuit court of this county for trial. And the court being of the opinion that the said John W. McCall is entitled to bail doth order that he be let to bail himself in the sum of five hundred dollars and his securities the like sum, which bail the accused failed to give, and it is further ordered that it be entered of record that the said McCall is entitled to bail himself in the sum of five hundred dollars, and his securities in the like sum.
