Kincheloe & Co. vs Kincheloe

The Commonwealth of Virginia, To the Sheriff of Prince William County, Greetings: We command you, that of the goods and chattels of Hector Kincheloe late in your bailiwick, you cause to be made the sum of One hundred and thirteen dollars and twenty six cents with interest thereon at the rate of six per centum per annum from the 2nd day of January 1855, till paid, which James H. Simpson, Elias W. Kincheloe and William Smith merchants and partners under the name and firm of Kincheloe & Company lately in our County Court of Prince William, hath recovered against the said Kincheloe for debt. Also, the sum of \$7.41 which to the said Kincheloe in the same Court were adjudged for his cost by him about his suit in that behalf expended; whereof the said Kincheloe is convicted as appears to us of record; and that you have the same before the Justices of our said Court at the Court-house of said County, on the first Monday in May next, to render to the said Kincheloe & Company of the debt and cost aforesaid; and have then there this writ. Witness, Philip D. Lipscomb, Clerk of our said Court, the 15th day of March 1856 in the 80th year of our foundation.
