This route is southwestward from the Fairfax County line on State 28; (Centreville) – Manassas – Milford Mills – Bristow – Nokesville – (Catlett); Fairfax County line to Fauquier County line. 14.4 miles.

“From Wellington on County 622 to a junction with County 674, 0.9 miles; (L) here to the entrance (R) to LARKINGTON, 1.4 miles to a modern frame house, which includes at its rear two rooms of a house dating back to the eighteenth century. It is said that Thomas Larkin settled on this land in 1792 and that the older house was then standing. In 1801 Larkin bought the tract of 901 acres from Benjamin Dulany and his son, Benjamin Dulany Jr. The home has remained in the Larkin Family for six generations.
