Historic Name: Lebanon Hall

Date or Period: Late ca. 1865

Original Use: Residence

Vicinity: Manassas

"This large, two-story, L-shaped, double-pile, frame-built house has a high gable in the front, which creates a large attic. When it was originally built as a farm house for the Library tract, the original room arrangement consisted of a central hall with a stair rising on the left. The house is said to have been named Lebanon Hall because it is built of Lebanon cedar, although there is disagreement about this claim. From 1907 to 1919 the house was the residence of E. R. Conner, a meat market and grocery store operator, farmer, member of the Manassas Town Council for twenty-five years, and delegate to the Virginia General Assembly between 1940 and 1944.
