Historic Name: Old All Saints Catholic Church

Date or Period: 1878-1879

Original Use: Church

Vicinity: Manassas

"All Saints Catholic Church is a one-story, nineteenth-century, Victorian-Romanesque-style, frame church with three low, telescoping additions on the south end. The red sandstone for the foundation is from a local quarry. The builder, John A. Cannon, was responsible for many other buildings in Manassas. Located near the site of Manassas' first railroad depot, this is the oldest church still in use in Manassas. In 1974 a new Roman Catholic Church was constructed on Stonewall Road, and the old church was purchased by the Presbyterian Church of America. The building is distinctive in style, is in good condition, and has changed very little. Its architecture is rare in this part of Virginia.
