

Historic Name: R. L. Byrd House

This small, two –story, frame, weather board house has its main entrance in the gabled end, a plan common in farmhouses and stores but rare in Manassas residences during the period in which it was built. The one-story, front porch is simple, having plain, round columns; a turned newel post; and a plain rail and square balusters. Under the metal-covered gabled roof is a plain box cornice with a plain soffit and gabled returns. Among interior features are four-panel doors, symmetrically molded trim with cornerblocks, and pine floors.
