

Carter, Sarah J. vs J. R. Pugh and William Pugh
Prince William County to wit:

James R. Purcell assignee of Sarah J. Carter plaintiff complains of J. R. Pugh & William Pugh defendants who were summoned to answer a plea that they render to the said plaintiff the sum of \$151 which to him they owe and from him unjustly detain. And therefore the said plaintiff says that heretofore to wit: on the 31st day of December 1857 the said defendants executed to Sarah J. Carter (by whom the bond was assigned to plaintiff) their bond, sealed with their seals & to the court now here shown by which they promise to pay to Sarah J. Carter on order the said sum of \$151 (the date of which bond is this day & year last mentioned) on the 1st day of January 1859 by the hire of two servants, Abraham & Sarah, for the year 1858. That on the (blank) day of (blank) she, the said Sarah J. Carter assigned said note to plaintiff, by writing her name on the back thereof for the value received, by reason of which assignments the defendants become liable to pay the amount of said bond to the plaintiff according to the tenor defect thereof. But the said defendants or either of them although often requested so to do, have not paid said sum of money or any part thereof, but the same to pay have neglected & refused & still neglect & refuse to the damage of the plaintiff \$50 & therefore he brings suit &c.
