Historic Name: Woodbine Baptist Church

Date or Period: Late ca. 1875

Original Use: Church

Vicinity: Independent Hill

One of the few surviving nineteenth-century churches in the area, this small, twenty-foot-by-thirty-foot, gable-roofed, frame-built, country church is covered with channeled siding. It rests on a newly built stone foundation. The one-room interior has a molded chair rail, plaster walls, and a pine floor. Plain, pine box pews are arranged to form a central aisle. The church was relocated to this site in 1962 and renovated by its congregation in 1973 to celebrate the church's one-hundredth anniversary. Originally known as Union Grove Church, it was built by volunteers on land donated by E. C. Lynn, a Canova farmer.
