In Prince William Circuit Court, October 11th 1860

Thomas Fairfax, plaintiff against Wilmer McLean, defendant in Chancery

It appearing to the Court that the Plaintiff has proceeded at the rules to have his bill taken for confessed as to all the defendants, this cause came on this day to be heard on the bill so taken for confessed and the exhibits filed and it appearing to the court that the defendants Wilmer McLean and Virginia B. McLean are indebted to the plaintiff in the sum of \$154.50 cents with interest thereon from the 2nd July 1860 and that the defendant Wilmer McLean is insolvent, the court doth further order and decree that unless the said debt and interest together with the costs of this suit are paid within three months from the date of this decree, that the Sheriff of said County shall take possession of the property of the wife V. B. McLean sufficient to pay the said debt interest and costs and sell the same according to law to satisfy said debt interest and costs.
